



Job Opening: Raven and Eagle Technician

Organization: Craighead Beringia South

Location: Jackson Hole, Wyoming

Timeframe: 1 September - 20 December

One field technician needed to help capture, tag, and take blood samples from Common Ravens, Bald Eagles, and Golden Eagles during the 2011 fall hunting season in Jackson Hole, Wyoming.

Qualified applicants must have banding experience for larger birds or raptors and knowledge of hunting/guns is preferred. Duties include procuring and dragging heavy road-killed animals up to ½ mi, setting traps pre-dawn and post-dusk daily, watching baits for extended periods of time, and banding of multiple (up to 25) birds each capture. Other duties include equipment maintenance, data entry, distributing non-lead ammunition to the public, and interacting with hunters on a daily basis. Field days will be long and cold and many will be spent alone. Applicant will be required to strictly adhere to bear safety protocols. Housing will be provided in Jackson, WY, approximately 10 miles from the study site in Grand Teton National Park.

Qualifications include at least a bachelor's degree in wildlife ecology or a related field. Experience with ArcGis preferred. A \$1600/mo stipend will be provided in addition to housing. Applicants must have a clean driving record.
